1st Grade “Highlights”

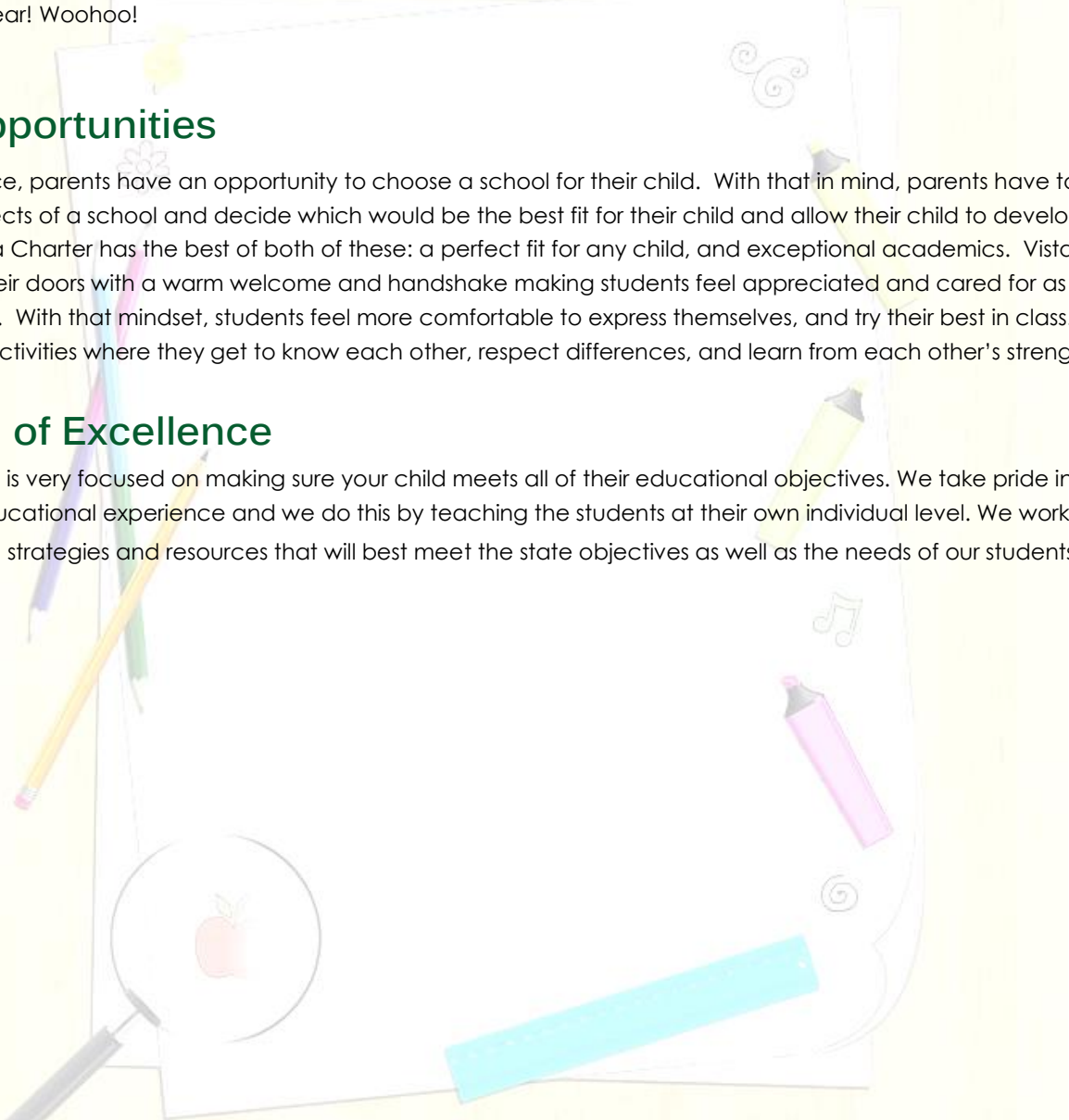

When I am not teaching, I love to read, Paint, draw, and watch Disney and Marvel movies. I also enjoy relaxing and having fun with my family.

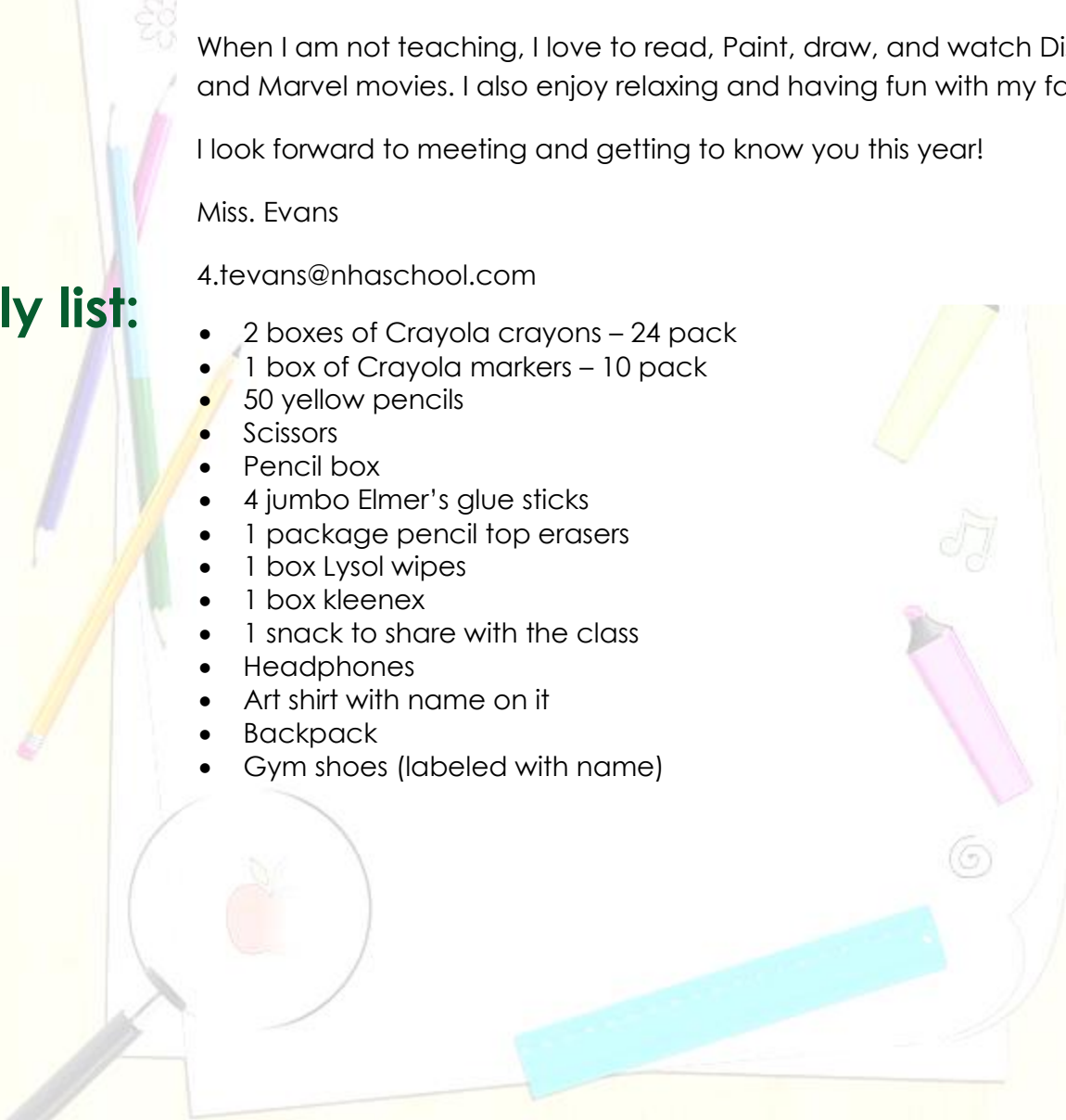
